PS. In November 2011 a further copy of the black and white drawing of Pyrford Place - measuring 165mm by 112mm - emerged which is almost certainly original. This notwithstanding Peggy usually retained the copyright and original of her drawings. Both front and back of the drawing are shown in the List of Images,

Again in January 2012 Kevin Smith produced a pen and ink original drawing by Mrs Howarth - measuring 18 cm by 13.5 cm – of *The House in the Wood with Appletreewick* on the back indicating that the drawing was made when the artist was living at West Byfleet. The house featured was on Horsell Common to the left of Monument Road after the Six Crossroads but it was incorrectly titled. It is, in fact, Thistle Cottage another house on the same site.
